- Pre-entry is required for all shows. Entry forms are located on the Registration / Entry Forms tab. Mail-in or online registration will be available on the website. (hamblencountyfair.org)
- Health papers are required for all animal entries. Registration papers and lease papers (where appropriate) are required for all registered animals.
- Out of control animals will be disqualified.

Fair Entry Rules and Regulations

- Open Show Competitions (Departments A1, B1, C1 and D1 ONLY) are open to anyone who can exhibit their animal WITHOUT assistance. Market Steers (Dept. A2), Dairy Steers (Dept. B2), Market Goats (Dept. C2), Market Lambs (Dept. D2) and Commercial Ewes (Dept. D3) are NOT Open Shows. These and all other competitions are open to Junior contestants ONLY.
- Junior Show Competitions (all Departments except A1, B1, C1 and D1) are subject to the following rules rules on age or grade:
 - a. All youth exhibitors must be members of 4-H or FFA by January 1, 2024
 - b. Competition is limited to either 4-H members who were enrolled in the fourth grade or later and FFA members who were enrolled in agriculture education courses on January 1 of current calendar year and who have not reached the end of the calendar year of their high school graduation or the end of the calendar year of their 20th birthday, whichever comes first.
 - c. When grade divisions are used, the exhibitor should enter the grade he or she was enrolled in as of January 1 of the current year.
- 3. Only 2023-2024 projects may be exhibited and only work done since the fair last year is eligible.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter only one entry per lot, except livestock which has a maximum of two (2) entries per lot.
- 5. Items except livestock must be made or grown by exhibitor.
- 6. All animals must be cared for and fed by exhibitor. Feed will be furnished by the exhibitor.
- 7. All entries must be in place before assigned judging.
- 8. All livestock entries must be in place as listed in the catalog for each individual class.
- At the conclusion of the fair, the exhibitor must claim and take charge of exhibits. Claim checks must be presented before an exhibit can be removed.
- 10. The right is reserved to withhold any award where it appears fraud or deception has been made. Judges' discretion will be used in opening canned items if fraud or deception is expected.
- 11. The fair management reserves the right to interpret the rules and regulations and to settle all questions that may arise.
- 12. No articles made from kits will be accepted as eligible entries unless specified in specific category.

- 13. All protests must be in writing to the president accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds for protesting.
- 14. Protests against the exhibition or any entry must be filed at least two hours before the lot is judged and will be considered and determined before the judging of said lot.
- 15. Protests against an award must be filed within 23 hours after the show on the day the award is made and will be determined at the first meeting of the rules committee.
- 16. These rules apply to all departments, except where noted and should be read by every exhibitor, who should govern himself accordingly. The fair reserves itself the sole and absolute right to construe its own rules and regulations and to determine arbitrarily all matters and differences in regard thereto, from which no appeal lies.
- 17. In the event of conflict of general and special rules, the latter will govern.
- 18. All property of every character, whether entered for exhibition, display or sale, or any other purpose will be taken into the grounds and buildings and kept entirely at risk of the owner, who assumes all responsibility for any loss, damage, theft or accident that may occur. Neither the fair nor its officers or agents will be responsible for any such loss, damage or theft, and it is directly understood that exhibitors, concessionaires and all other persons, firms or corporation having property on the grounds and desiring protection from such loss or damage must make their own arrangements therefore.
- 19. The solicitation of funds or the distribution of handbills, political literature, religious pamphlets or any type of promotional material is prohibited on fair property unless it is given out from rented space. No posting of advertising material will be allowed on the buildings, barns or fences unless approved in writing by the management.
- 20. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the grounds.
- 21. No smoking in barns or exhibit buildings.
- 22. Animals are not permitted on the grounds unless they are part of an authorized show or exhibit. Guide dogs for the disabled are the exception.

Livestock Specific Rules

Registration is REQUIRED. You must register with complete information including email on the entry form and the form must be received in the Hamblen County Extension office no later than June 30, 2024. They can be mailed, emailed, faxed to the office or completed online at hamblencountyfair.org. If emailed or faxed the entry fees must be received within 10 days of the email/fax. You will receive an email confirmation once your registration and/or payment is received.

AFTER JUNE 30 NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

- 1. Be sure to use separate registration forms for each species and breed of animal and also for each exhibitor. Complete information is required.
- 2. No more than two (2) entries allowed per lot.
- 3. There will be NO REGISTRATION the day of the show.
- 4. Departments A1, B1, C1, and D1 ONLY are considered Open Shows and will be open to anyone who can exhibit their animal WITHOUT assistance.
- 5. All other Departments (except A1, B1, C1 and D1) will be considered Junior Shows and you must be a current 4-H and / or FFA member (4th -12th grade on January 1, 2024) in order to compete in the competitions. There are some exceptions for "Little" classes in beef cattle, dairy cattle, goat and sheep.
- 6. Animals may only be exhibited in either breed (registered) or as market or commercial classes. They cannot be entered into multiple categories.
- 7. There will be spaces allocated in the barn for you to tie/stall your animals. Please plan to use only the space allocated for you and to work with others to make the best accommodations for everyone. Sheep and goat exhibitors may bring your own panels to use within the warm-up arena for additional separation if preferred but you may NOT show from you trailer.
- 8. Please ensure that you keep aisle ways clear and open for the movement of animals.

- 9. Generators may be brought and used but must be kept outside of the barns.
- 10. Shavings may be available for sale from the Expo Center. Any other bedding may be brought in by the exhibitor.
- 11. There will be a Supreme Champion selected for each species. Eligible animals will come from the respective Grand Champion classes.

- 1. All birds must meet health regulations according to State requirements. The chairman reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 2. Only one entry per gender per lot. Entries consist of single birds in large breeds and Bantam breeds.
- All poultry <u>must be pre-entered</u> by completing either the Poultry and Rabbit Entries Form or register online at hamblencountyfair.org. 4-H Chick Show
- Open to 4-H members participating in the 2024 4-H Poultry Program. Out of county entries must be signed by 4-H agent guaranteeing participation in the project.
- 2. Only one entry per 4-H member. Entry to consist of three pullets.

Department F - Skillathon (Junior Show)

- Skillathon is an educational delivery method where a facilitator conducts a "learning station" where youth can gain knowledge or demon-strate their knowledge and skills learned by doing livestock project work.
- 2. Skillathons enhance learning through "hands-on" activities and enhance project skills.
- 3. The learning stations are breeds, quality assurance, health, management, showmanship, feed/nutrition, selection/judging, product evaluation and equipment. However, other topics may be included.
- 4. The skillathon is open to everyone. Youth do not have to be exhibiting an animal to participate.
- 5. No awards will be given but results will be used in calculating the scores for the Premier Exhibitor.

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TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE DIVISION OF CONSUMER & INDUSTRY SERVICES ANIMAL HEALTH

SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

GENERAL:

- A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.
- All livestock (except poultry and equine) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)
- No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.
- II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

A. SWINE:

All swine which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

B. CATTLE:

All cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent, official identification.

C. POULTRY:

(1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the Tennessee Department of Agriculture at least **thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.**

(2) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

D. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve (12) months.

E. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, with the exception of wethers under the age of 18 months that are produced for slaughter only, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

F. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

- G. CAMELIDS: Camelids must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).
- H. CAPTIVE CERVIDAE: Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01 (1).

III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside the State of Tennessee shall be subject to current Tennessee import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows: A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry):

Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days and individual permanent official identification, except for equine. Equine must have sufficient description to identify the animal.

B. CATTLE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

(1) Tuberculosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of tuberculosis.

(2) Brucellosis: No requirements except for cattle originating from regions not considered free of brucellosis. Test eligible cattle – Intact male or female cattle eighteen (18) months or older. (Vaccinates and non-vaccinates)

C. SWINE:

No testing requirements for swine unless originating from a region not considered free of Brucellosis and Pseudorabies.

D. HORSES AND OTHER EQUINES:

Animals six (6) months of age or older - negative equine infectious anemia (Swamp Fever) test within twelve (12) months.

E. POULTRY:

Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock and an H5/H7 Avian Influenza Clean Flock or be accompanied by evidence of a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days and a negative Avian Influenza test within twenty-one (21) days.

F. SHEEP

(1) All sheep imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) All sheep that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

G. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individu ally identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

H. CAMELIDAE: Same requirements as for cattle.

I. CERVIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Brucellosis: Same requirements as for cattle.
- (2) Tuberculosis:
 - (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within twelve (12) months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within thirty (30) days of entry; or
 - (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to two (2) single cervical tests at least ninety (90) days apart, the second test conducted not more than thirty (30) days prior to entry.

NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of import rules).

IV Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evidence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.
